Purpose

This presentation provides an overview of the recently published *Specifications Manual for National Inpatient Psychiatric Facility Quality Measures* (IPF Specifications Manual), Version 1.2, as well as updated optional resources.

Objectives

Attendees will be able to leverage the IPF Specifications Manual, Version 1.2, and other updated resources to meet all data reporting requirements for fiscal year (FY) 2026 payment determination year.


IPF Specifications Manual, Version 1.2, and Updated Resources Review **IPF Specifications Manual Overview**

The IPF Specifications Manual is intended for use as a reference to facilitate successful collection and submission of patient-level and facility-level data to CMS for the IPFQR Program.


- Effective date: January 1, 2024
- Reporting Period: Calendar year 2024 discharges for all measure and non-measure data, except Influenza Immunization (IMM-2) (October 1, 2024–March 31, 2025) and quarterly reporting of the COVID-19 Vaccination Coverage Among Health Care Personnel (COVID HCP) measure
- Submission Period: Summer 2025 (except the COVID HCP measure) impacting the FY 2026 annual payment update
- Composition: One main document and two Extensible Markup Language (XML) file layouts pertinent to patient-level and facility-level reporting of IPFQR Program data

Guidelines for Using Release Notes

Release Notes Version 1.0b provides a high-level overview of changes to the Specifications Manual for National Inpatient Psychiatric Facility Quality Measures (IPF Specifications Manual). This Release Notes document is to be used as a reference and is not intended to be used to develop abstraction tools. Please refer to the IPF Specifications Manual for references to the complete and current technical specification and abstraction information.

These notes are organized to follow the Table of Contents in the *IPF Specifications Manual*. The headings are described below:

- Impacts used to identify the impacted measures and portion(s) of the Inpatient Psychiatric Facility Quality Reporting Program Manual section (e.g., Measure Specifications, Appendix).
- Rationale provided for the change being made.
- Description of Changes used to identify the section within the document where the change occurs (e.g., Definition, Data Collection Question, Allowable Values, and Denominator Statement).

Note: Additions are called out specifically in the Release Notes and yellow highlighted in the corresponding document. The changes in the IPF Clinical Data and IPF Facility Level XML File Layouts have yellow highlighted cells with actual changes noted in **bold**.

Major Changes in the IPF Specifications Manual

Introduction

In the **Introduction** of the manual, sub-bullets in the fourth paragraph were updated to provide information regarding the CMS Certification Numbers (CCNs) that are eligible to participate in the IPFQR Program.

- Psychiatric Hospitals: Last four digits of CCN between 4000 and 4499
- Units at acute care hospitals: "S" in the third position of the CCN
- Units at critical access hospitals: "M" in the third position of the CCN
- Units at Long-Term Care Hospitals: "SA", "SB", or "SC" in the third and fourth position of the CCN
- Units at inpatient rehabilitation facilities: "SD" in the third and fourth position of the CCN
- Units at children's hospitals: "SE" in the third and fourth position of the CCN

This change aligns with CMS guidance regarding provider types that bill the Inpatient Psychiatric Facility Prospective Payment System, as described on pages 409–411 of the CMS State Operations Manual.

Section 1: Data Dictionary

In Section 1:

- Reference to the IPF Global Sampling was removed.
- The first bullet in the **Exclusion Guidelines for Abstraction** for the *Blood Glucose, Blood Pressure, Body Mass Index (BMI), and Lipid Panel* data elements changed to the following, based on changes from the Screening for Metabolic Disorders measure's steward:
 - "Non-quantitative assessment of glucose test (for example, normal, abnormal, etc.) a range of values, or greater than or less than a value"
- Details about the following, optional data elements were added for clarification and can be used internally by IPFs:
 - o Physician 1
 - o Physician 2

Section 4: Population and Sampling Specifications

In Section 4 of the IPF Specifications Manual, Version 1.2, the second sentence in the third paragraph under *Sampling* was changed to provide a more general example:

"For example, during the reporting period an IPF may have 100 patients who were discharged during the measurement period."

Changes in the **Guidelines for Submission of IPF Clinical Data** sub-section include the following:

- Guidance regarding the use of numeric CCNs in the XML file layout.
- Clarification regarding the specifications for the Sex data element for the IPFQR Program measures, effective January 1, 2024.

Using Numeric CCNs in the XML File Layout

Provider

Data elements in this section of the XML file relate to Provider identification. These data elements include:

- CMS Certification Number IPF's six-digit CCN, which is required by CMS.
 The CMS Certification Number (CCN) must be a valid, numeric, 6-digit number. IPF units that are part of a larger hospital must replace the letter(s) in the IPF unit specific CCN as follows:
 - Change "S" to "0"
 - Change "M" to "1"
 - Change "SA" to "20"
 - Change "SB" to "21"
 - Change "SC" to "22"
 - Change "SD" to "30"
 - Change "SE" to "33"

Free standing IPF CCNs are numeric; therefore, no changes are needed.

The list of CCNs eligible for the IPFQR Program was updated per information in the <u>CMS State Operations Manual</u>

Specifications for the *Sex* Data Element, Effective January 1, 2024

Note the following changes in the specifications for the Sex data element for the IPFQR Program measures, effective January 1, 2024.

- The data element is defined as "The patient's documented sexual orientation and/or gender identity."
- There are six valid values, and an abstractor can select all that apply.
 - 1 Male
 - 2 Assigned/Designated Male at Birth
 - 3 Female
 - 4 Assigned/Designated Female at Birth
 - 5 LGBTQ
 - 6 Unknown
- Up to five valid values may be selected, but the field size for each occurrence is "1".
- If value "6" is selected, then no other value should be selected.

Changes to the definition of the Sex data element align with the definition in

The Joint Commission's specifications manual.

Updates were also made in the IPF Clinical Data XML File Layout to align with those described in the manual. The purpose of the IPF Clinical Data XML file is to submit patient-level data.

Section 5: Data Transmission Guidelines for Submission of Facility Level Data

Changes in the **Guidelines for Submission of Facility- Level Data** sub-section include guidance regarding the use of numeric CCNs in the XML file layout, as displayed on slide 14 for the IPF Clinical Data file layout. Changes align with the list of provider types that are eligible to participate in the IPFQR Program, per the <u>CMS State Operations Manual</u>.

Updates were also made in the IPF Facility Level XML File Layout to align with those described in the manual.

Note: The purpose of the IPF Facility Level XML file is to submit aggregate data, including the non-measure data and data elements pertinent to the denominator value for the Hospital-Based Inpatient Psychiatric Services (HBIPS)-2 and HBIPS-3 measures.

Reporting Periods vs. Fiscal Years


The IPFQR Program: Understanding Reporting Periods vs. Fiscal Years document:

IPF Vendor Management



- Measure set definitions pertinent to vendor access for chart-abstracted measures




