# CMS Response to COVID-19

CMS issued an Extraordinary Circumstances Exception (ECE) memo that exempts IPFs from submitting measure and non-measure data for discharges that occurred from January 1, 2020 through June 30, 2020. This means IPFs are not required to submit measure and non-measure data for January 1, 2020 through June 30, 2020 discharges during the summer 2021 data submission period.

# CY 2020 Non-Measure Data Collection Tool

CMS modified the non-measure data collection tool, effective for CY 2020 discharges, in three major ways:

- Updated instructions to identify and categorize discharges by diagnostic code
- Revised instructions to respond to the global sampling question
- Added an appendix containing coding crosswalks

# CY 2020 Non-Measure Data Collection Tool

CMS revised the non-measure data collection tool, effective for Q1–Q4 2020 discharges, to include updated instructions to identify and categorize discharges by diagnostic code. The Agency for Healthcare Research and Quality adopted Clinical Classifications Software Refined (CCSR) codes under the Healthcare Cost and Utilization Project which uses different category names and descriptions from the Clinical Classifications Software (CCS) used in prior years. To ensure that IPFs identify discharges by the appropriate diagnostic categories, crosswalk tables were created.

This paper tool is provided as an optional, informal mechanism to aid inpatient psychiatric facilities (IPFs) in the collection of non-measure data for the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) Inpatient Psychiatric Facility Quality Reporting (IPFQR) Program. To define the diagnostic categories above, please note the following:

- Categorization should be based on the primary diagnosis at discharge.
- Diagnostic code grouping to report non-measure data to CMS utilizes crosswalks between the categories developed for the Clinical Classifications Software (CCS) and the Clinical Classifications Software Refined (CCSR) under the Healthcare Cost and Utilization Project by the Agency for Healthcare Research and Quality. Access the crosswalk tables of these codes with International Classification of Diseases, Tenth Revision, Clinical Modification (ICD-10-CM) codes for discharges in calendar year 2020 (January 1, 2020 through December 31, 2020) in the Appendix at the end of this document.

# CY 2020 Non-Measure Data Collection Tool


CMS updated the non-measure data collection tool effective for Q1–Q4 2020 discharges to include clarification to respond to the global sampling question, referring to version 5.1 of the IPFQR Program Manual for details about the global sampling methodology.

<b>Note:</b> If the IPF used the global sampling methodology described on page 18 of the IPFQR Program Manual, Version 5.1, for any of the measures collected in calendar year 2020 for submission in 2021, then the IPF should answer "Yes" to the sampling question. As a reminder, the Hospital-Based Inpatient Psychiatric Services (HBIPS)-2 and HBIPS-3 measures do not allow sampling.

## Prior Crosswalk

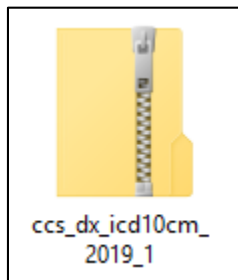
In prior years, the CCS code table for ICD-10-CM diagnoses could be downloaded in a zip file from the Agency for Healthcare Research and Quality's Healthcare Cost and Utilization Project web page. The zip file contained the crosswalk file, viewable as an Excel spreadsheet.



Archives for Previous Beta Versions of the CCS for ICD-10-CM Diagnoses

Copies of previous beta versions of the CCS for ICD-10-CM diagnoses are available for users who need to replace or access the old programs. The beta version of the CCS includes ICD-10-CM codes valid through September 2019 and will not be updated for codes added after October 2019 (fiscal year 2020).

- **CCS v2019.1 (beta version):** Fiscal Year 2019, Updated October 2018 - valid for ICD-10-CM codes through September 2019

- **CCS v2018.1 (beta version):** Fiscal Year 2018, Updated October 2017 - valid for ICD-10-CM codes through September 2018

- **CCS v2017.1 (beta version):** Fiscal Year 2017, Updated October 2016 - valid for ICD-10-CM codes through September 2017

# CY 2020 Non-Measure Data Collection Tool

## Prior Crosswalk

Upon opening the file, you could filter the spreadsheet to show the ICD-10-CM codes that correspond with the CCS category in question. For example, below is a partial list of the 51 ICD-10 CM codes associated with CCS Category 651 for anxiety disorders.

# CY 2020 Non-Measure Data Collection Tool

## New Crosswalk

In the new CCSR code table you can filter the spreadsheet to show the ICD-10-CM codes that correspond with the CCSR category in question. Below is the same partial list of ICD-10 CM codes associated with anxiety disorders; however, the CCSR spreadsheet does not list the CCS categories, which led to the creation of the crosswalks you will find in the appendix of the CY 2020 Non-Measure

# CY 2020 Non-Measure Data Collection Tool

## New Crosswalk

CMS updated the non-measure data collection tool effective for Q1–Q4 2020 discharges to include an appendix with six coding crosswalks. The crosswalks contain the ICD-10-CM Code and the associated CCSR Category I Code and description.
